PLUMAS COUNTY KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION PLAN

PURPOSE: The Plumas County Transition Plan supports the transition from early

childhood to school age settings.

TIMELINE: November through August

PRINCIPLES OF SUPPORT FOR KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION:

- 1. Transition to school should occur in such a way that children and families have a positive view of school and children perceive themselves as competent learners.
- Transition should create continuity from one environment to the next. When transitions are eased and supported, the gaps between systems are bridged and continuity results.
- 3. Transition should be culturally appropriate and communication is provided in the home language.
- 4. Families are an integral part of the transition activities.
- 5. Effective transition coordinates pre-school and kindergarten programs and establishes communication between the sending and receiving staff.
- 6. Transition programs should use evaluation information to improve programs and practices.
- 7. Both sending and receiving programs will maintain open communication and respect.
- 8. Transition is recognized as a process that children and families experience rather than the event that happens to a child (Harvard Family Research Project).

The Plumas County Kindergarten Transition Plan was developed by the Plumas County School Readiness Program's Early Childhood Education/Teacher Workgroup, a collaborative working group of First 5 Plumas, Plumas Unified School District, Head Start, Feather River College-Early Child Hood Development Division, Plumas County Child Care and Development Planning Council, and preschool programs throughout Plumas County.
